Imagine an expansive, lush and green oasis in the southeastern corner of the Mojave Desert, just a few miles from the hustle and bustle of the Las Vegas Strip.

This is a place where over 200 million gallons of recycled water and runoff flow through the lowest part of the Las Vegas Valley each day. Known as the Las Vegas Wash, the water runs 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It travels an 8-mile path east to Lake Mead, the vast reservoir serving the municipal, industrial and irrigation needs of more than 25 million Americans in the southwest.

Straddling the Wash is Clark County Wetlands Park. Created with four unique desert habitats, the 2,900-acre managed wild area provides diverse habitat for native plants and wildlife.

CONNECT TO PLACE

The Wetlands Park is a special place for the approximately 1.5 million visitors who have come to appreciate and enjoy it since its opening in 1999.

Park visitors can delight in seeing ducks, geese, herons, egrets and other birds dabble, wade and feed in the Wash and man-made ponds and streams. They can and other evidence of coyote, raccoon,

bobcat, beaver, rabbits and other critters abound near water sources and throughout the Park. Over 20 miles of trails wind through the habitats, providing many opportunities for walking, biking, and seeing nature at its best. Most park-goers agree that every visit to Wetlands Park is a new and exciting experience.

A PLACE FOR FRIENDSHIP

Many people visit regularly and may have developed personal relationships with the Park as volunteers. They staff the Park’s Exhibit Hall; clean the Park of trash and debris; participate in the planing of native trees, bushes and wildflowers; guide school-aged children on educational tours, and lend a hand in family-friendly programs and popular events.
